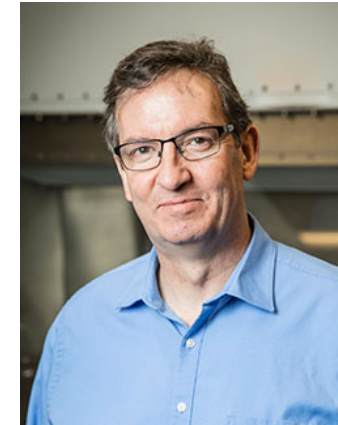

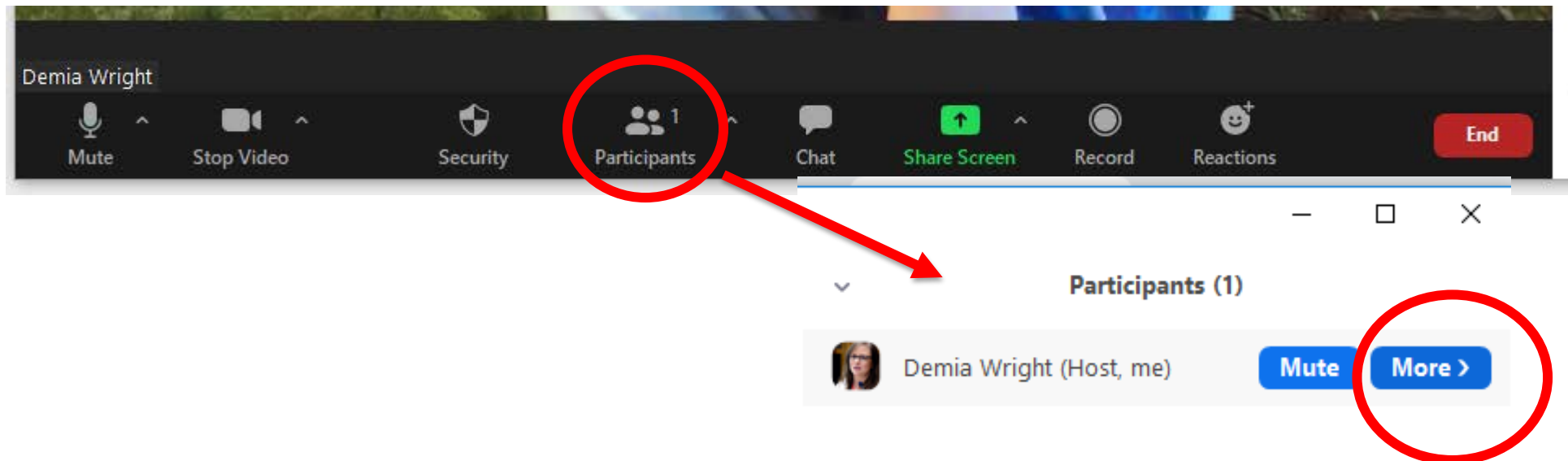
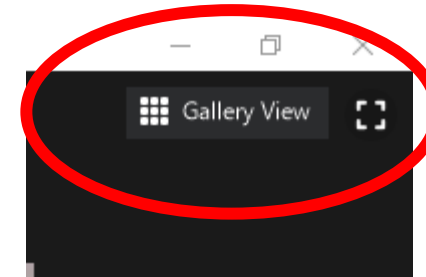

NIEHS Guidance

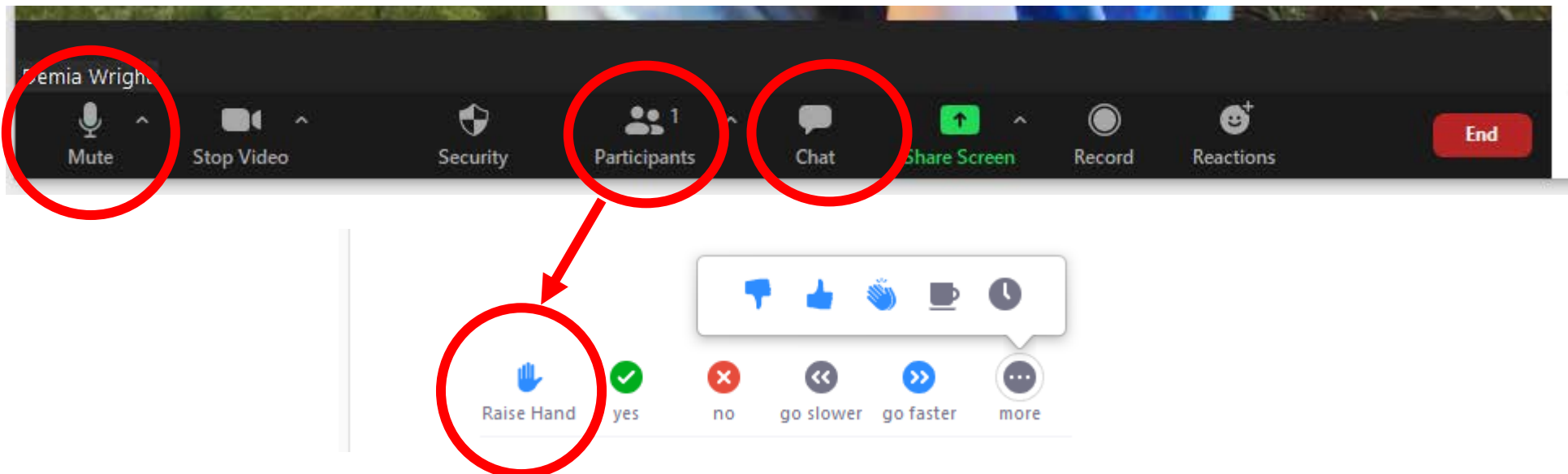
- Each grantee is making their own decisions on training in-person based on their policies, procedures, capacity, and workforce training needs.
